Overall Comments

This is a really solid start to the course. Your submission is appropriate and it's great that you have taken the opportunity to photograph outside your comfort zone. Your reflections and contextual research are really strong. It's clear that you are engaging with your shoots. The overall narrative doesn't quite convey your ideas however, it's a good attempt and it's evident you have learnt a lot. As discussed, try and restructure your learning log/blog as it is confusing. You have sound content that is difficult access due to duplication and a confusing menu structure. It feels like you are over complicating accessing the information.

Continue to work on assignment two, keep up the momentum and remember you are on a learning journey so continue to push your creativity and practice.
